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Explanation of terms

Refraction: ONLY prescription for glasses

Digital Retinal Photography (Pictures) – includes a photograph of the inside of your eyes and can be done in about five minutes. In most cases, EYE DROPS ARE NOT NECESSARY to get a retinal picture! This process allows the doctor to view a much larger portion of the inside of your eye than with a general eye exam and check for any abnormalities. Such abnormalities include bleeding from diabetes or high blood pressure, leaking of fluid into the eye, glaucoma, macular degeneration, sun damage, tumors, and other serious issues. The photograph also allows the doctor to save an accurate image of your eye in order to track the worsening or improvement of potential sight threatening diseases (“baseline” images). Many issues can only be seen when the pictures are analyzed, which would allow us to address small problems before they become critical. This option is *strongly recommended*.

Dilation – includes special eye drops that enlarge the pupils. The purpose of the dilation is to make the pupil (black part of the eye) larger so that our Doctors can get a better look into the periphery/walls inside your eyes. It allows us to check for holes, tears, retinal detachments and other abnormalities that might be present.
